

1. Will first-year students go through the orientation process?

 Yes. First-year students will undergo a detailed orientation process.

2. What processes are set in place to aid a new student through the orientation?

• The University is fully equipped to support the new students in all aspects. Students are expected to report to the admissions office on the left side of the main entrance. Counselors and mentors have been identified to answer all queries and solve any issues. Freshers can be rest assured that they will have a safe and comfortable time at the campus.

4. What are the university's safety and hygiene measures to protect students and teachers during the pandemic?

• All COVID-related safety measures have already been set in place as per the UGC and the State Government guidelines. Thermal Scanning and automatic sanitizer machines are used at strategic locations throughout the campus. A Taskforce is set up for student monitoring and faculty coordination by each school of the University. Additionally, there is also a residential doctor, nurse and a 24-hour dedicated ambulance at the university campus for any emergency purpose.

5. What are the dining and pantry arrangements for on-campus students?

• Dining arrangements have been made for all with social distancing norms in place at the respective messes. An all-new food court has been launched considering all social distancing and hygiene norms. It caters to a wide variety of cuisines, from North



Indian, South Indian, to Pan Asian cuisines. Apart from this, we also have a bakery making fresh bakes, a Pizza counter, and a *chaat* counter. The food court is also functional for day scholars and others not living on campus.

6. Do I have to wear a mask while on campus?

• Wearing a mask is mandatory at all times on the campus.

7. Will the University provide a COVID Kit to students?

• Students are advised to carry their own sanitizers, hand wash, face shields, masks and other safety equipment while on campus. Students can also procure the items from our in-house stationery shop.

8. Is the university recommending the use of fabric face masks?

• Students are advised to wear masks that offer at least a two-layer protection, fabric or otherwise.

9. What should I do if I fall sick or begin showing symptoms?

• The concerned person should immediately report to the REVA Health Centre on the campus.

10. Should I self-isolate if I've been in contact with someone being tested for COVID-19 or who has tested positive?

• Yes. The University has made arrangements on the campus for quarantine/self-isolation of individuals.

11. Can graduate/research students and postdocs return to labs?

• Yes, you can. All students are advised to follow social distancing norms and safety precautions on the premises.

12. Which courses will be taught in person and which will be taught online?

• Subject to the safety guidelines being followed, the University is striving to ensure that most of the subjects/courses are taught in person



13. Will I be able to study online if I don't prefer being on the campus?

• Yes, but it is highly recommended that students are present for the offline classes.

14. Where and how can I get tested for COVID on the campus?

 Arrangements have been made for COVID testing within the campus.

15. How often should I get tested if I am living on campus?

• Testing is required for those living on the campus only if they present flu-like symptoms.

16. My neighborhood has many COVID-19 cases. Is it advisable for me to come to the University every day?

• We trust everybody to take personal precautions at all times, get regular tests and medical checkups done, follow the UGC and state govt. guidelines to ensure safe learning for yourself and members around you.

17. What about students traveling from other states?

• Students should report to the campus with a COVID test certificate confirming that they tested negative.

18. Are visitors allowed on campus?

 No. Visitors are presently not allowed on campus owing to the safety precautions.

19. Is the University currently offering campus tours?

• Currently, no. A decision regarding campus tours will be taken purely on a case-to-case basis.

20. Are there any students already on campus?

• Yes, there are students involved in research activities staying on campus. They have been staying here since June 2020 and working in research labs.



21. Are consent letters from parents mandatory?

• Yes, consent letters or consent mails from parents are mandatory for the students to carry while coming back to the campus.

22. Will hostel students be permitted to go out of the hostel block?

• Yes, hostel students are permitted to move around inside the campus following all the required COVID protocols.

23. What are the health facilities provided to students by the University?

 REVA Health Centre at the University provides cost-effective quality healthcare services with highly qualified physicians and nurses. Facilities like CT-Scan, Ultrasound, X-Ray and ECG along with clinical diagnostics are available to the REVA student community round-the clock. There is also a dedicated Ambulance within the campus that is on call 24/7.

24. Is REVA Health Centre situated within the campus?

 Yes, REVA Health Centre with all the modern facilities is situated within the University Campus

25. Do you have a doctor residing within the campus?

 Yes, Paramedical staffs, nurse and physician also resides within the campus.

26. What are the arrangements made by the University to shift patient to any bigger hospital, if required?

 REVA University has its own dedicated ambulance with driver available for 24/7. In case of any emergency, Columbia Asia and Aster CMI hospitals can be reached within 10 mins.

27. Is there any medicines available within the campus?

 Yes, emergency medicines are always available and stocked in the REVA Health Clinic.
