# Introduction

As part of the academic enrichment initiative, the School of Architecture, REVA University, organized an alumni interaction session for the sixth-semester B.Arch students engaged in a Mixed-Use Development / Large-Scale Design Studio Project. The session was aimed at enhancing student understanding through professional inputs from alumni working in the field.

# **Objective of the Session**

- To facilitate meaningful interaction between alumni and current B.Arch students.
- To support design development by providing practical inputs from industry professionals.

## **Key Areas Discussed**

- Site zoning, circulation, and land-use distribution
- Integration of contours in design
- Placement and logic of services (water, sanitation, parking, etc.)
- Built form articulation and user-centric design thinking

### **Session Format**

The session was conducted in an open studio format and included the following components:

- Pin-up reviews of ongoing student work
- Desk critiques offering individual guidance and feedback
- Group discussions focusing on design strategies, master planning clarity, and presentation improvements

The informal yet focused setting allowed students to engage in constructive conversations with professionals in a peer-review style format.

### Outcomes

- Students received constructive feedback on how to improve both their conceptual and technical approach.
- Alumni appreciated the level of work and recommended further refinement in integrating services.
- Suggestions were made for better use of space, pedestrian movement, and real-time functioning of mixed-use typologies.

### Conclusion

The alumni mentoring session was a valuable academic intervention that provided students with a real-time understanding of how large-scale architectural projects are conceived, planned, and implemented. The interaction reinforced the importance of academic rigor combined with practical application, and students expressed appreciation for the professional feedback.
