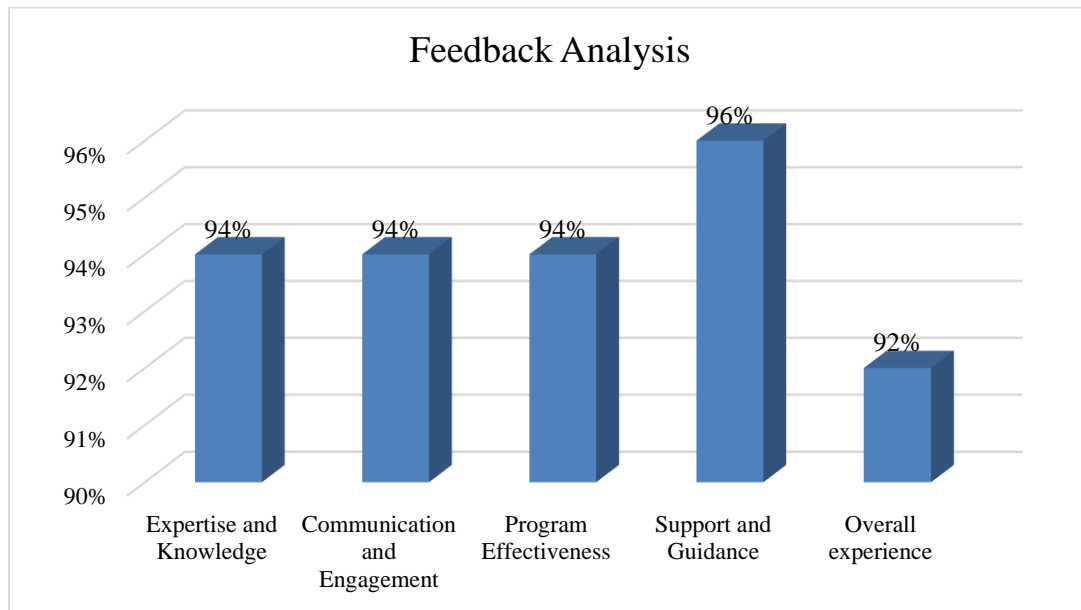
Vote of Thanks:

- Nothing as of now

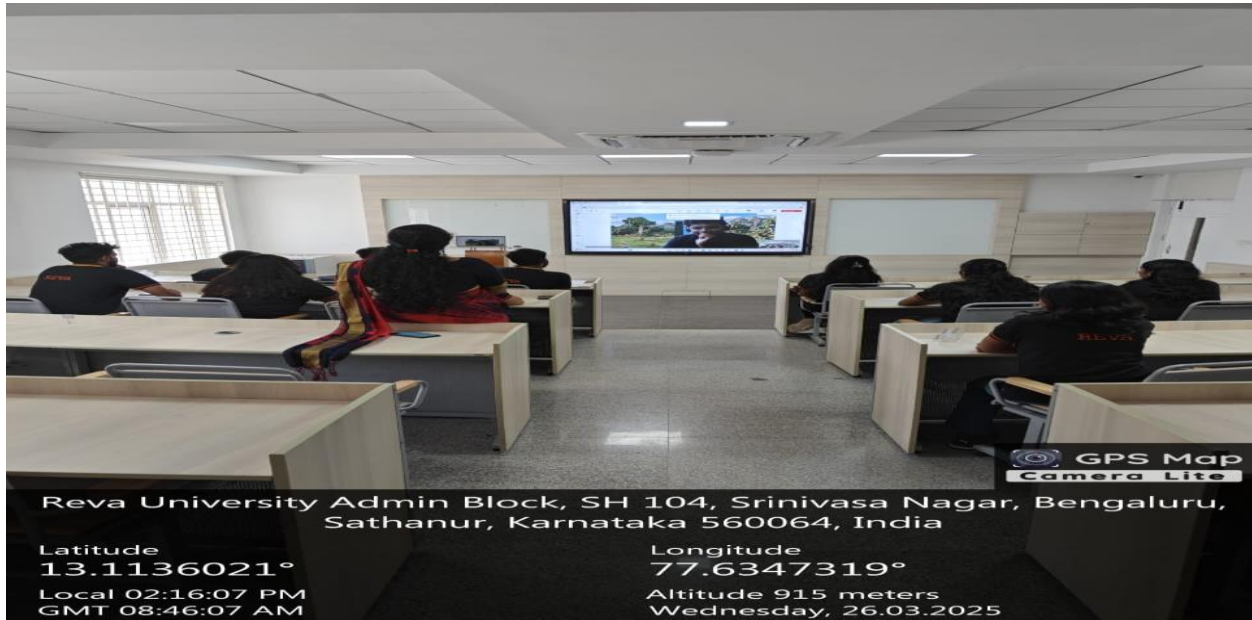
Actions Taken Report
