✓ Launch of the "Sustainable Greater Greener Bengaluru" Survey

A citizen-led survey was launched to gather public insights on sustainability, aimed at shaping policy and community programs.

Eminent speakers from civic bodies, academia, NGOs, and environmental advocacy groups shared practical strategies, innovations, and policy needs for urban green reform.

✓ Namma Earth Wards Initiative

✓ "Weave for Change" – Eco Fashion Show

Talented youth designers from across Bengaluru showcased sustainable fashion created from upcycled and eco-friendly materials. It highlighted circular design principles and youth creativity.

Recognition & Rewards Ceremony – Impactathon Winners

Winners of the **Impactathon** (Walk, Run, & Ride) held as part of the campaign were honored for their enthusiasm in promoting low-carbon lifestyle choices.

The university's commitment to sustainability was further demonstrated through the active participation of its NSS Unit, students from the **School of Architecture**, and the **Centre for Sustainable Development**.
